omeSafe welcomed 100 golfers to work on their short game for a cause that goes a long way. The annual *Charity Golf* tournament hosted for a second year at High Ridge Country Club was sold out. A record-breaking \$100,000 was net, with the proceeds going toward helping thousands of children and families who have endured unimaginable trauma and to help prevent future cases of abuse.

HomeSafe is a nationally accredited nonprofit protecting Palm Beach County's and South Florida's most vulnerable residents — victims of child abuse and domestic violence. Through its results-driven approach, the organization is a leading provider of prevention and intervention services, serving more than 15,000 infants, children, young adults and families each year. HomeSafe is one of just five specialized therapeutic group care agencies in the state of Florida — the only one in Southeast Florida.

In total, 25 foursomes participated in the tournament. First place in the women's division was won by **Genevieve Murphy**, **Aileen Farrell**, **Kathleen Long** and **Lisa Addeo**; Men's division winning foursome was **Phil Lafounttine**, **Mike DaSilva**, **Jason Eggers** and **Jon Daniel**; and the first-place winner in the mixed foursome division was **Andrew Waldman**, **Kristen Bissett**, **Ana Waldman** and **Aric Waldman**. An impromptu call to the heart during the lunch program raised an additional \$57,000 to help fund the reconstruction of the Bernstein Family Foundation residential campus. The Boca campus will soon be a safe, healing home for children who have experienced life-altering abuse and neglect.
