They will participate in an all-expense paid 10-day field studies program in preparation for their performances on Broadway's Minskoff Theatre stage on June 24th.

Dreyfoos School of the Arts, Outstanding Featured Female Dancer; and Adam Picariello-Heighes from A.W. Dreyfoos School of the Arts, Outstanding Featured Male Dancer. And the The King's Academy received the Outstanding Musical *Award* for its production of *Big Fish*.

Judges at this year's *Dream Awards* included **Kevin Covert**, Broadway Actor and Chair of Musical Theatre at Shenandoah Conservatory; **Crista Moore**, Broadway, TV and Film Actress, Singer, Dancer and two-time Tony Award® nominee; and **Dennis Stowe**, Broadway, TV and Film Actor, Singer, Dancer and currently starring as "Jafar" in Disney's *Aladdin* on Broadway. The event featured the *Dream Awards*' 15-piece orchestra under the direction of Broadway veteran, **Steve Freeman**.
